Our SDSA small business vendors need to join with the other 501 c 6 industry non-profits who are currently working towards a government funded Business Interruption Fund to help us pay our overhead when pandemics, strikes and other disasters put a halt to production. The SDSA needs to create a Business Member Emeritus membership level for retired business owners so the SDSA may continue to benefit from their experience and wisdom. Most importantly the SDSA needs ongoing financial and physical support to continue the projects, programs and events that this organization has established over the past thirty years. Continuity and tradition are very important to the reputation and long-term success of any organization.
